#### **Hutchison Terminals**

At the end of national council last week we held a meeting in Sydney on Friday 10 July with Hutchison's management (and their hired guns, some Sydney corporate lawyers) and an MUA team consisting of Sydney and Queensland branch officials and rank-and-file representatives. Warren Smith, Assistant National Secretary, is the national official handling the matter.

The meeting was worrisome as it was largely defensive and useless. Hutchison's claim is that they want to 'contract their market share' to stem their alleged corporate losses. Their proposed answer is to savagely and unilaterally cut the workforce, with the minimum involvement of the members and their union in this process.

All MUA members and officials present at this meeting condemned Hutchison for taking this ultraaggressive right-wing style of industrial relations. Because the meeting produced little else but a show of force from the lawyers, Hutchison delegates coordinated with Qld Branch Secretary, Bob Carnegie, and gave a full report back to members of the current situation at an urgent meeting held in the union rooms at Cannon Hill on Sunday 14 July at 11am.

There was a very strong show up of all available offshift members. All members present are to be praised for their steadfastness and maturity at this difficult time. Good work for arranging the urgent meeting on Sunday!

Dark clouds are appearing in the stevedoring industry; however our union has weathered these times before and will again. The Queensland and Sydney branches as well as the national leadership will be giving Hutchison no quarter. The once 'white knight' of the stevedoring industry has shown its true colours – that of a ruthless transnational container terminal operator.

### **Alexander Spirit**

At the time of writing, the Alexander Spirit is still alongside in Devonport. This battle is being fought so that there is a future for blue water Australian seafarers. There is a song by the Dubliners in which a cooper laments his lost trade in these few lines —
